

What to expect from your Life Insurance Interview and Exam



🛱 Telephone Interview

SBLI is pleased to offer our applicants the most convenient way to complete their SBLI life insurance applications—a 20-30 minute phone call with an experienced customer service professional.

Having the following information will help ensure an efficient interview:

- Your driver's license and if applicable other form of governmentissued identification (example: permanent resident cards, visa etc.)
- Names, addresses, and phone numbers of doctors and clinics you visited in the past five years
- The names and dosages of any prescription or over-the-counter medications you take
- A list of medical conditions or diagnoses, including date of diagnosis, treatment, result of treatment, and treating physician information
- Assets, liabilities and net worth (including personal and household income)

During the call, you'll be asked if you're interested in e-delivery.

If available through your agency, you may have the option to elect to have important documents, including your policy, sent to you electronically upon approval of your application.

If it is determined that you require a medical exam, one will be scheduled at the end of the interview.



Medical Exam

A brief, no-cost medical exam will be conducted by a trained medical examiner at a time and place of your convenience. The examiner will call one or two days before the exam to confirm it. This exam will take 20-30 minutes.

The examiner will:

- Measure your height, weight, blood pressure, and pulse
- Collect blood and urine samples
- Potentially administer an EKG (electrocardiogram), depending on your age and amount of desired insurance coverage

To ensure a successful exam:

- Get a good night's sleep prior to the exam
- Avoid significant exercise on exam day
- Avoid alcoholic beverages for at least eight hours prior to the exam
- Avoid tobacco or caffeine products for at least one hour prior to the exam
- Fast for at least two hours prior to the exam (12 hours is preferred)
- Drink a glass of water two hours prior to the exam to help produce a urine specimen
- Let the examiner know of any medications you are taking
